

Dr. Ibrahim Frantz Fanon



- Ibrahim Frantz Fanon was a Martinique-born psychiatrist, political philosopher and Pan-Africanist. He used clinical research and his lived experience of being a black man in a racist world to analyze the effects of racism on people particularly on people of color and of the economic and psychological impacts of imperialism. Although Leukemia claimed his life at 36, his work continues to inspire liberation movements internationally.
- His books *Black Skin, White Masks* and *The Wretched of the Earth*, influenced many from <u>Jean Paul Sartre</u> (who wrote "You who are so liberal, so humane, who take the love of culture to the point of affectation, you pretend to forget that you have colonies where massacres are committed in your name." in the preface to *Wretched*) to Malcolm X, inspired activists in the <u>National Liberation Front</u>, Black Panthers, the Black Lives Matter movement and more.
- The African Review of Political Economy states: "In Fanon's intellectual journey, we can see the interactions between Black America and Africa, between the intellectual and the militant, between theory and practice, idealism and pragmatism, individual analysis and collective action, the psychological life (he trained as a psychiatrist) and physical struggle, nationalism and Pan-Africanism and finally between questions of colonialism and those of neocolonialism."
