

## Queen Nzingha of Ndongo and Mataba.



- Queen Nzingha, also known as Ana de Sousa Nzinga Mbande, was a queen of the Ndongo and Matamba Kingdoms (occupying what is now <u>Angola</u> in the southern part of Africa).
- ♣ During her negotiation of a peace treaty in 1622, the Portuguese told her to sit on the floor. She refused and her maids offered their backs as a stool so she could negotiate as an equal with the Portuguese representatives.
- ♣ She was strategic in building intra-African alliances, and was never captured. The military superiority of Njinga's army and her ability to build alliances made <a href="her the most feared figure in the Angolan wars">her the most feared figure in the Angolan wars</a> in the 17th century.
- Most images of her are portrayed in a Eurocentric context, but a more authentic image, a willful woman carrying an axe, is captured in the official sculpture for independence (<u>Kinaxixi Square, Luanda,</u> <u>Angola</u>).
